



# April 25-28, 2023 CONCERTS AND EVENTS FOR HOUSTON, TX

In 2017, WindSync launched the Onstage Offstage Chamber Music Festival to connect Houston's people and places through music. By making extraordinary chamber music accessible to both seasoned and new audiences in concert halls and in non-traditional spaces around the city, we hope to make our city a more creative and livable space.

While the creative placemaking movement is gaining momentum around the globe, it is most often associated with the visual arts rather than the performing arts. Small ensembles are perfect for reaching out to communities at large because they are portable, they don't require sets, and they provide audiences with the opportunity to experience live music in their own neighborhoods. The values of placemaking-galvanizing community involvement and addressing the needs of a particular place--perfectly match the goal of chamber music ensembles as we engage audiences in the concert hall and beyond.

This year, Onstage Offstage welcomes partnerships with music programs at Kinder HSPVA and Houston Youth Symphony's Coda Music Program. The programming includes a Gershwin and Lecuona celebration at Midtown Arts and Theater Center Houston, workshops with students to bring a new series of pieces to life in concert at Zilkha Hall, and casual pop ups at spaces throughout the city.

The 2023 Onstage Offstage Chamber Music Festival includes partnerships with local businesses and organizations including Houston Farmers Market and the Center for Performing Arts Medicine. We welcome Yvonne Chen, Rainel Joubert, and David Connor, three of our most-admired Houston musicians, as guest artists.

# WINDSYNC IS

Houston's wind quintet. We infuse a traditional, if uncommon, genre of Western classical chamber music with relevancy and energy by focusing on collaboration, innovation, and programming for the members of our community. Since the ensemble's founding in 2009, WindSync has developed a reputation as one of the finest North American small ensembles, backed by prizes in chamber music performance from the Concert Artists Guild Victor Elmaleh Competition (2012), the Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition (2016), and the M-Prize Chamber Arts Competition (2018).

WindSync's thematic programming responds to the people and places where we work. We lead collaborations with some of our favorite Texas musicians, recently including composers Ivan Trevino, Erberk Eryilmaz, Mason Bynes, and Akshaya Avril Tucker, and our local presenting partners include the Lunar and Planetary Institute, the Center for Performing Arts Medicine, and Brazos Bookstore. We have served on the Texas Touring Roster for the Texas Commission on the Arts since 2018.

WindSync's robust international touring career has led to appearances at the Library of Congress, Ravinia, Strathmore Mansion, Shanghai Oriental Arts Center, and Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall. Our album *All Worlds, All Times* was released on Bright Shiny Things in 2022, debuting at No. 2 on the Billboard Traditional Classical charts. In November, we traveled to London to record our next album, featuring the music of Uruguayan-American composer Miguel del Aguila, in the iconic Studio Two at Abbey Road Studios. During this year's festival, we perform the Texas premiere of the latest piece in our growing catalog of commissions, a new work by phenom flutist and composer Nathalie Joachim.

WindSync aims to connect with audiences of all ages and backgrounds. Each year, we perform for over 5,000 students, and in 2022, we received the Fischoff Ann Divine Educator Award, recognizing achievements in the areas of both artistry and education.

# MUSICIANS OF WINDSYNC



### Garrett Hudson, flute

Recognized by the Winnipeg Free Press for "shaking up the classical music world", Garrett Hudson is a founding member of WindSync. The Canadian flutist's roots lie in Winnipeg, Manitoba, where he emerged at the age of 16 in a solo debut with the Winnipeg Symphony. Garrett completed a Bachelor of Music degree at the University of British Columbia, studying under Scottish flutist Lorna McGhee, and he earned his Master of Music degree from Rice University's Shepherd School of Music under the tutelage of renowned flute pedagogue Leone Buyse. Garrett is usually found behind the wheel of a minivan while WindSync is on tour and is a coffee and wine enthusiast.



### Emily Tsai, oboe

A lifelong musician, Emily Tsai began her musical studies at age four on the violin and added the oboe at age ten. Based in Washington, DC, she performs as Assistant Principal Oboe of the Washington National Opera and the Kennedy Center Opera House Orchestra. She has made solo appearances with the Alba Music Festival Orchestra, the Amadeus Orchestra, the Paragon Philharmonia, and the Washington Asian Philharmonic, among others, and she is a teaching artist at the PRIZM Festival in Memphis. Tennessee, which connects and promotes musicians of diverse backgrounds. Emily holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music and University of Maryland, and her primary teachers include Mark Hill. Richard Killmer, and Malcolm Smith. She also earned a degree in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology from the University of Rochester. Emily loves spoiling her cats, watching video games, and spending time outdoors.



### Graeme Steele Johnson, clarinet

Graeme Steele Johnson has established a multifaceted career as a clarinetist, writer and arranger. His diverse artistic endeavors range from a TEDx talk comparing Mozart and Seinfeld, to his reconstruction of a forgotten 125-year-old work by Charles Martin Loeffler, to his performances of Mozart's Clarinet Concerto on a rare elongated clarinet that he commissioned. He has appeared in recital at The Kennedy Center and Chicago's Dame Myra Hess series, and as a chamber musician at Carnegie Hall, the Ravinia Festival, Chamber Music Northwest, Phoenix Chamber Music Festival and Yellow Barn. He holds degrees from the University of Texas and Yale University, and he is now a doctoral candidate at the CUNY Graduate Center under the mentorship of Charles Neidich.

### Anni Hochhalter, horn



Born in California and raised in Las Vegas, Nevada, Anni became interested in chamber music and innovation in the arts after touring with ensembles across North America, Europe and Asia. Anni is principal horn of the McCall Music Festival in McCall, Idaho, and she performs on vocals, electronics, and horn with the band Late Aster. She studied horn at the University of Southern California. Anni is a former winner of the Yen Liang Young Artist Competition. A graduate of Stanford University's Executive Program in Social Entrepreneurship, she is currently executive director and musician chair of WindSync. Based in San Francisco, California, Anni enjoys trail running and backpacking in her spare time.

### Kara LaMoure, bassoon

Originally from Dallas, Texas, Kara LaMoure broke into the world of chamber music as a founding member of the Breaking Winds Bassoon Quartet, a comedic crossover group known for its web presence and connection with young musicians. Kara previously performed with the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra and the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, and she can be heard on the original soundtrack to *The Hobbit: The Desolation of Smaug.* A teaching artist, Kara has coached youth orchestras in Switzerland, Honduras, Mexico, and Brazil.She holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music and Northwestern University, and before joining WindSync, she served on the faculty of the University of Missouri. Between performances, Kara keeps busy adding to her prolific portfolio of arrangements for chamber winds.




# LUNCH CONCERT AT CRAIN GARDEN

### Rainel Joubert, violin

Cuban-born violinist Rainel Joubert joined the Houston Symphony as a Community-Embedded Musician in 2016. He has performed with the National Symphony Orchestra of Cuba and the Opera and Ballet Orchestras of Havana. His many awards include being named one of the four finalists of the 15th Annual Sphinx Competition and Second Prize in the Violin Competition and Best Interpretation of Cuban Music at the 2006 Union de Escritores y Artistas de Cuba (Cuban Artists and Writers Union). As a member of Sphinx Virtuosi (SV) he performed in important halls such as New World Center (Miami), Kennedy Center (Washington), Carnegie Hall (New York), and participated in extensive community engagement activities. Joubert speaks three languages (Spanish, Portuguese, and English) and holds a Master's Degree in Music Performance from the University of Southern Mississippi.

### David Connor, bass

David Connor was born in Chelmsford, MA and began playing the double bass when he was nine years old. He joined the Houston Symphony as a Community-Embedded Musician after two seasons with the New World Symphony in Miami Beach, FL. Connor earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts at Carnegie Mellon University and his Masters of Music at Rice University's Shepherd School of Music. While at Rice, he was a fellow of the DACAMERA Young Artist Program for two seasons, which led to many community outreach opportunities and chamber music collaborations in the greater Houston area. He has had the opportunity to teach double bass both at home and abroad, traveling to Medellín, Colombia and Geneva, Switzerland.

### Yvonne Chen, piano

Taiwanese-American pianist Yvonne Chen performs across the US as a solo recitalist and a chamber musician. Recent collaborators and presenters include Kaleidoscope Chamber Orchestra, Monarch Chamber Players, MUSIQA, Performing Arts Houston, Music in Context, DACAMERA, and Houston Chamber Choir. In Houston, upon receiving the 2017 Presser Graduate Music Award at Rice University, she co-founded Loop38, whose concerts have been featured in Houstonia Magazine, Houston CityBook, Arts and Culture TX, and the Houston Chronicle. Originally from the Washington, DC area, Chen received degrees in piano performance from the Juilliard School and graduated with a doctoral degree from Rice University's Shepherd School of Music in December 2019. # ABOUT THE CODA MUSIC PROGRAM



In 2015, Houston Youth Symphony expanded its reach into the community with the HYS Coda Music Program, an El Sistema-inspired after-school project that targets children from lowincome families in Houston's Near Northside neighborhood. El Sistema began in 1975 in Venezuela and is now replicated in programs around the globe. El Sistema uses music education to engage children in a safe and fun environment, while helping them build selfesteem and a sense of value.

The HYS Coda Music Program brings graduated, intensive instruction to third, fourth and fifth grade students after school in select Houston ISD Fort Bend ISD elementary schools. Current participating schools are Clemente Martinez, Jefferson, Ketelsen, Looscan, and Sherman Elementary Schools in HISD, and E.A. Jones and Hunters Glen Elementary Schools in FBISD. Using group instruction to build community and social transformation through string ensemble and performance opportunities, the program meets twice a week on each campus after school, free of charge to all participants and schools. Two hours every afternoon are devoted to music instruction, which includes rhythm class, group lessons, music theory, composition and ensemble playing. Coda groups perform for their schools at assemblies, and join together to perform as a large ensemble for community gatherings.
